# Grilled Salmon

Salmon fillet, with the skin Sea salt, or an infused salt (I like lime/ginger) Brown Sugar Soy Sauce \*no amounts given, just go by preference

Cooks Corner

Place salmon skin side down on foil. (the skin helps the meat stay together, if you use

skinless, use a cooking spray on the foil. Rub the salt and brown sugar over the top of the fillet.

Pour soy sauce over the top.

Place on grill approx. 350 deg (med heat) and close the lid. 20 minutes later take it off the grill and enjoy!
